Present and Apologies: Conducted remotely with Ian Humphries (Treasurer), Liz Leonard (Chair), Joanna Walsh, Kath Richardson. Apologies from existing trustees Elena Milova, Lucy Standish and Sheila Matthews

Supervisor's Report

We have carried on with the 30 hours – offering 6 hours per day, even though we had lost money on the extended hours since the last AGM. However it has picked up a lot in January 2020 to 15 children on some days. We are also able to offer flexible hours to 2 and 3 year funding and fee paying children.

We are outstanding in our Inclusion and Support of SEN children. One child went on to Linden Bennett Specialist Nursery and we have currently 7 children on our SEN register. We have twins with cerebral palsy and one child needed a risk assessment passed before they were able to start. Two children are undergoing EHCP's, one with a diagnosis of Autism and two more children are on the Autistic pathway. The staff have continued to update their training termly and Liz has attended the Learning and Development, and Welfare Clusters termly.

The Tropical Zoo came in July 2019 and all the children were invited. We have celebrated Diwali, Chinese New Year, Holi, Eid, Christmas, Easter and World Book Day.

We had visits from Hounslow Early Years, SEN, other Schools, Physiotherapists and an Education Psychologist, so that all of our children can reach their full potential. Unfortunately the outbreak of the coronavirus has now taken over. We have been steaming all the toys and equipment making sure the children keep washing their hands, teaching them how to catch a sneeze. We are wiping everything in sight with anti-bacterial wipes and making sure parents and children wash their hands when they enter the building and the parents again when they come back to collect their child.

We are now closing down today (20^{th} March), for the foreseeable future. We have all the parents emails, so we can still keep in touch with them and will follow the governments guidelines on when we can re-open.

Treasurer's Report

This was our second year with 30 hours provision. In the previous year we made a profit of almost £15,000; this year we made a loss of just over £1,000. Our fees had halved without an equivalent rise in funding.

The new pension costs have almost doubled to £3,700 and will go up again next year in the final automatic

rise.

Our lowest paid wage (£9.15) continues to be at the rate of the London Living Wage set in November 2014. It's currently £10.75 which we cannot afford but well over the national minimum wage of £8.72.

We currently have two signatories, myself and Ian Humphries.

Election of New Committee

Due to the current situation this AGM was conducted remotely and it was decided to carry on with the current committee rather than try and get new trustees.
